Weather: Mainly dry with occasional clear then brighter spells appearing. The few showers that do appear expected overnight and evening, with snow level 500m.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 80-90%

Low cloud and visibility: Good becoming moderate or poor in rain showers, very poor in snow showers and within cloud with bases infrequently lowering to 600m

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Cold at height with a significant chill effect.

Forecast for Tuesday 06 Dec 2022

Weather: Rather cloudy across the north with occasional showers, best of brighter spells towards Ben Alder where showers will be quite isolated. Snow level 400-500m descending to lower levels from late afternoon.

Maximum wind: North to northeast mean around 20-25mph with gusts reaching 35mph across most exposed ridges and summits

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: for any given instance 70% in north and 95% in south, but given the showery nature of the flow limited chance of extended clear periods.

Low cloud and visibility: Good becoming moderate or poor in rain showers, very poor in snow showers and within cloud with bases lowering to 400m as showers push through.

Temperature: **Glens:** Minus 3 Celsius increasing 6 Celsius for the afternoon
At 800m: Minus 3 Celsius lowering Minus 5 Celsius later
Freezing level: 600m lowering 200m later
