Forecast for Sunday 04 Jul 2021

Weather: A few showers continuing during the night with patches of mist and low cloud. A dry, bright start to Sunday although mist patches lingering towards the Caithness hills. Scattered showers breaking out later in the morning, becoming heavy in the afternoon, especially in south of area with isolated thunderstorms.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 60%

Visibility: Mist and low cloud lingering over Caithness hills but dispersing elsewhere. Otherwise generally good visibility with clouds well up the hills, then marked deteriorations to poor visibility in the afternoon as heavy showers come along bringing extensive cloud cover about 600 to 700m.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Winds will be light and so the showers will be slow moving in the afternoon taking a bit longer to pass by.

Forecast for Monday 05 Jul 2021

Weather: A lot of mist and low cloud to start the day. This will thin and break up with sunny spells developing. Showers will develop early in the day and becoming frequent and heavy during the morning with a risk of thunder. Further slow moving heavy showers in the afternoon and evening.

Maximum wind: Light winds at all levels, mainly southeasterly on the tops, average speeds of 10mph.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 40%

Visibility: Misty conditions at first improving good during the morning, with clouds lifting and breaking up. Then occasionally poor visibility as heavy showers pass by with clouds coming well down the hills.

Temperature: **Glens:** 14 Celsius at dawn rising to 22 Celsius by early afternoon.

At 800m: 14 Celsius.

Freezing level: Well above the summits.
