Forecast for Saturday 02 Apr 2022

Weather: A cloudy start but bright or sunny spells developing through the day. Largely dry, just the outside chance of a light snow flurry late afternoon.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 80%

Low cloud and visibility: Generally very good with good air clarity, cloud largely above summits. Some cloud above 700 metres for a short time first thing in the morning but this patchy in nature.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Note low summit temperatures. Full winter conditions on high ground.

Forecast for Sunday 03 Apr 2022

Weather: Much of the day will be dry with some hazy sunshine. Rain, briefly preceded by snow, and widespread hill fog is expected to spread from the northwest from mid to late afternoon onwards. Rain turning patchier in the evening.

Maximum wind: West to south-westerly 30 to 50 mph on the summits by afternoon

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 60%, best chance in the morning period

Low cloud and visibility: Generally very good with only small amounts of cloud on the summits in the morning. Becoming poor in extensive low cloud down to 500 metres from mid-afternoon onwards

Temperature: **Glens:** Minus 2 rising to 11 Celsius
At 800m: Minus 1 rising to 6 Celsius
Freezing level: 500 metres, rising above summits by evening
