Inshore Waters Forecast to 12 miles offshore from 0001 UTC to 2359 UTC

General Situation

A cold front will slowly clear southeast England on Tuesday. Remaining areas of the United Kingdom will come under an unstable airflow which will be strong in southern areas with a risk of gales.

From Cape Wrath to Rattray Head including Orkney

24 hour forecast:

Southwesterly backing southeasterly 3 or 4.

Showers.

Moderate or good.

Slight or moderate.

Rattray Head to Berwick on Tweed

24 hour forecast:

Southerly 3 or 4.

Mainly fair.

Showers.

Slight or moderate.

Berwick on Tweed to Whitby

24 hour forecast:

Southwesterly 3 or 4, increasing 5 at times in south.

Showers.

Moderate or good.

Slight.

Whitby to Gibraltar Point

24 hour forecast:

Southwesterly 4 or 5, increasing 6 at times in south.

Showers, but rain at first in south.

Moderate or good, occasionally poor at first in south.

Slight or moderate.

Gibraltar Point to North Foreland

24 hour forecast:

Southwesterly 5 to 7, decreasing 4 at times in north.

Rain then showers.

Moderate or good, occasionally poor at first.

Slight or moderate.

North Foreland to Selsey Bill

24 hour forecast:

Southwesterly 5 to 7, increasing gale 8 at times.

Rain then showers.

Moderate or good, occasionally poor for a time.

Moderate or rough.

Selsey Bill to Lyme Regis

24 hour forecast:

Southwesterly 5 to 7, perhaps increasing gale 8 for a time.

Rain then showers.

Moderate or good, occasionally poor for a time.

Moderate or rough.

Lyme Regis to Lands End including the Isles of Scilly

24 hour forecast:

Southwesterly 5 to 7, perhaps increasing gale 8 for a time.

Rain then showers.
Moderate or good, occasionally poor for a time.
Moderate or rough, increasing very rough later in west.

Lands End to St Davids Head including the Bristol Channel
24 hour forecast:
Southwesterly veering westerly 4, increasing 5 to 7.
Squally showers.
Moderate or good.
Rough or very rough.

St Davids Head to Great Ormes Head, including St Georges Channel
24 hour forecast:
Southwesterly veering westerly 5, increasing 6 or 7 at times.
Squally showers.
Moderate or good.
Moderate, occasionally rough in south.

Great Ormes Head to the Mull of Galloway
24 hour forecast:
Southwesterly, veering westerly 3 or 4, increasing 5 or 6 at times.
Showers.
Moderate or good.
Slight or moderate.

Isle of Man
24 hour forecast:
Southwest 4 or 5.
Showers.
Good becoming moderate in showers.
Mainly moderate.

Lough Foyle to Carlingford Lough
24 hour forecast:
Southerly veering westerly 3 or 4, increasing 5 or 6 later.
Showers.
Moderate or good.
Slight or moderate.

The Mull of Galloway to Mull of Kintyre including the Firth of Clyde
and the North Channel
24 hour forecast:
Southerly veering westerly 3 or 4, increasing 5 later.
Showers.

Mull of Kintyre to Ardnamurchan Point
24 hour forecast:
Southerly, veering southwesterly 3 or 4, occasionally 5 later.
Showers.
Moderate or good.
Slight or moderate.

Ardnamurchan Point to Cape Wrath including the Outer Hebrides
24 hour forecast:
Southeasterly, veering southwesterly 3 or 4, occasionally 5 later in
south.
Showers.
Moderate or good.
Slight or moderate.

Shetland Isles
24 hour forecast:

Southerly backing northeasterly 3 or 4.
Showers, fog patches at first.
Moderate or good, occasionally very poor at first.
Rough decreasing moderate.

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
