### Forecast for Monday 04 Jul 2022

**Weather:** Cloudy overnight and at first on Monday with scattered showers. The odd heavier shower is possible at first in north of area, then showers becoming fewer later in the morning. Then a brighter afternoon with some sunshine breaking through and just the odd light shower remaining.

**Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m:** 40% improving 70% in afternoon.

**Low cloud and visibility:** Extensive cloud cover at first around 600 to 700m with poor visibility on higher slopes and near to showers. Clouds lifting and breaking up later in morning and early afternoon with mostly good visibility.

## Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Note unseasonably cold, windy conditions over higher ridges and summits.

## Forecast for Tuesday 05 Jul 2022

**Weather:** Much of the day will be dry and bright with some sunshine. It will become cloudy later in the day with damp, misty conditions coming in from the west, especially to Creag Meagaidh and around Ben Alder.

**Maximum wind:** West or northwesterly winds, average speeds on the tops of 25mph with gusts 40mph.

**Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m:** 80% decreasing 30% during evening.

**Low cloud and visibility:** Very good visibility for much of the day with patchy cloud cover, bases about 800m. Poor visibility and lowering cloud bases edging in from the west later in the day.

**Temperature:** **Glens:** 8 Celsius rising to 18 Celsius.  
**At 800m:** Plus 7 Celsius.  
**Freezing level:** 1700m.
