


National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment
 Hopefully there should be some easing of the situation as we go further into Tuesday, but a tricky, wintry start in some places again.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Alert of Ice**

Valid from **00:00 on Tue, 06th Dec 2011** until **11:00 on Tue, 06th Dec 2011**

Snow showers will tend to ease, although with a further slight cover of snow still possible on Tuesday morning. Additionally, icy stretches are likely on untreated surfaces where wintry showers have fallen.

The public should be aware of potential disruption to transport networks.
