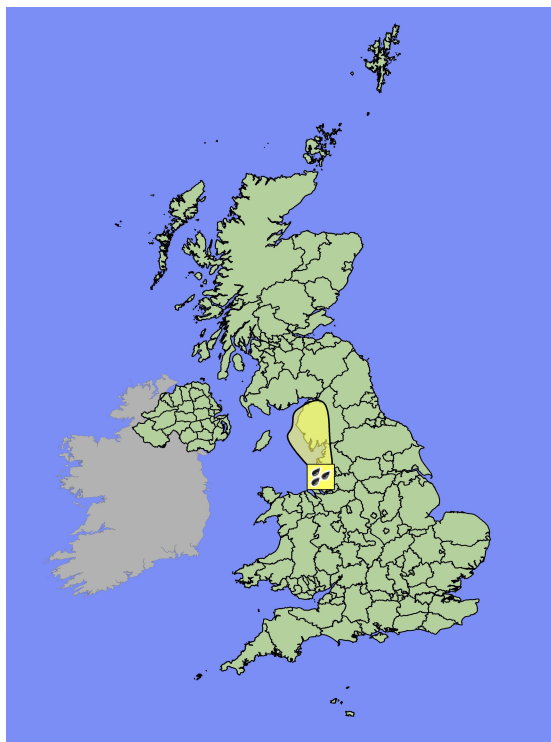




## National Severe Weather Warning Service



### Chief Forecasters Assessment

A narrow band of very heavy rain and thunderstorms that developed over Lancashire earlier this evening is moving northwards and is likely to affect parts of Cumbria overnight. Some 15-25mm could fall in an hour or two locally although as often in such situations some places should miss the worst. The showers should ease overnight.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **22:10 on Mon, 13th Aug 2012** until **05:00 on Tue, 14th Aug 2012**

Heavy showers and thunderstorms will continue to move north from Lancashire into parts of Cumbria overnight. The public should be aware of the risk of localised surface water flooding.
