



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment
 A frontal system will move up across Scotland during this evening. This will eventually clearing north later on Wednesday evening. Widespread totals of 30-40mm are expected and isolated 50-60mm over southeast facing slopes. With increased holiday traffic and outdoor activities, the public are advised to be aware of the risk of some disruption due to localised flooding.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **21:00 on Tue, 31st Jul 2012** until **22:00 on Wed, 01st Aug 2012**

An area of rain will become slow moving over the southern Central Highlands, Argyll, Arran. This rain will persist through this evening and much of Wednesday.
