Forecast for Sunday 09 May 2021

Weather: Quite cloudy overnight with some lingering patchy drizzle and light rain especially in the north. During the day conditions will gradually brighten up with cloud lifting and becoming more scattered. Some sunny spells will develop especially over more north and eastern ranges around the Assynt and Glen Affric. Showers will also develop by late morning especially around more westerly ranges like the Cuillins and Torridon, one or two of these will become more prolonged and heavy. Becoming mainly dry with a lot of cloud clearing on Sunday evening and feeling much warmer.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 60% increasing to 70%, some low cloud will shroud the tops in the morning otherwise tops will mainly be clear outwith heavier showers.

Visibility: Initially some scattered low cloud will shroud some ranges down to 600m however this will become quite isolated, mainly confined to western ranges. Generally cloud will mainly be above the tops but patches may fall to 600m in any showers that pass and perhaps 500m temporarily in heavier showers in the west. General visibility will be good, perhaps dipping to moderate or poor in any heavier showers.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Freezing level rising above all summits.

Forecast for Monday 10 May 2021

Weather: Mainly dry overnight but staying cloudy with a few mist or fog patches. Some bright or sunny spells in the morning but showers soon developing. The showers may become heavy with the risk of thunder at times in the afternoon especially for western ranges.

Maximum wind: Southeasterly 10-15mph with gusts 20-25mph, perhaps stronger gusts in heavy showers.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 80%, cloud bases mainly above the tops but perhaps slightly lower for a time early in the morning and in any heavy showers.

Visibility: Generally good visibility but cloud may fall below the tops at times first thing in the morning and may dip to 600m temporarily in any heavy afternoon showers.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 8 rising to 14 Celsius.
At 800m: Plus 5 rising to 8 Celsius.
Freezing level: Above the summits.
