Forecast Issued on Friday 02 Feb 2024 at 03:24 by Met Office Aberdeen

Confidence: High for unsettled conditions continuing throughout this period. Some uncertainty on the timing and extent of the heaviest rain during Sunday and Monday.

Headline for Friday 02 Feb 2024: Severe gales with risk of storm force gusts on the summits. Widespread low cloud and drizzle at first, brightening mid-afternoon.

Forecast for Friday 02 Feb 2024

Weather: Widespread low cloud with light rain and drizzle, but becoming brighter across eastern Aberdeenshire hills and more generally from mid-afternoon with a few showers following in the west. West-southwesterly gales, with severe gale or isolated storms force gusts on the summits.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 20%, but nearer 60% for eastern Aberdeenshire hills and more generally from mid-afternoon.

Low Cloud and visibility: Widespread cloud base 600-800m, occasionally falling to 400m in light rain and drizzle. Cloud breaking up and bases lifting to around 800-1000m from mid-afternoon. Away from cloud visibility hazy falling to just a few kilometres in drizzle, becoming generally very good later this afternoon.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Dangerous conditions on the summits with sudden gusts on lee slopes possible.

Forecast for Saturday 03 Feb 2024

Weather: Strong westerly winds, severe gale force on the summits. Occasional showers across western areas but drier in the east. Showers falling as snow above 800m.

Maximum wind: 45-55mph on the upper slopes, occasional 60-70mph gusts on the summits.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 60%

Low Cloud and visibility: Scattered cloud bases 800-1000m but suddenly falling onto lower slopes in showers. Visibility very good outside of showers.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 9 Celsius.
At 800m: Plus 1 Celsius.
Freezing level: 900m
