Forecast for Monday 07 Jun 2021

Weather: On the cloudy side, particularly first thing in the west, with this cloud dispersing during the first part of the morning. Perhaps brightest around the middle of the day, with some hazy sunny spells, but with an outside chance of this generating the odd moderate rain shower, perhaps slow moving in light winds. Higher cloud should increase and descend into the afternoon, giving a bright rather than sunny second half of the day, although the risk of showers should reduce.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 600m: 30 percent at first, with areas of cloud over the highest ground, dispersing by mid-morning to leave good views for the remainder of the day.

Visibility: Very good once early cloud clears the peaks. Moderating locally in showers later.

Forecast for Tuesday 08 Jun 2021

Weather: An appreciably cooler start than on Monday, with isolated valley mist patches soon dispersing to a fine and warm day with plenty of sunshine. High UV indices will be the most notable aspect of the weather, with adequate protection advised.

Maximum wind: Gradually increasing southwesterly 20mph.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 600m: Greater than 90 percent.

Visibility: Very good throughout.

Temperature: **Valleys:** Plus 5 becoming plus 19 Celsius.
At 600m: Plus 11 Celsius.
Freezing level: Well above the peaks.
