Forecast for Friday 03 May 2024

Weather: A mostly dry day with sunny spells, but a few heavy showers arriving in eastern Caithness and Sutherland through this evening. Mainly clear through the day, with some patches of low cloud or fog at first on eastern-facing upslopes. This soon clearing after dawn to leave long bright or sunny spells. Low cloud arrives from the east into eastern Caithness and Sutherland from the late evening with outbreaks of rain or drizzle.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: Generally above 90%, but falling to 30% or less in eastern Caithness and Sutherland after dark.

Low cloud and visibility: Generally clear with excellent visibilities, perhaps some patchy low cloud or fog in a few prone spots before dawn, but this soon clearing. Low cloud arrives into eastern Caithness and Sutherland later, with bases down to 200-300m and very poor visibilities in drizzle or hill fog.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist’s View

Prolonged sunshine may require suitable eyewear and skin protection.

Forecast for Saturday 04 May 2024

Weather: Extensive low cloud in eastern areas with outbreaks of rain or drizzle at times. Dry with bright or sunny spells by day in the west, particularly towards Torridon and Skye. Perhaps a few heavier showers at times with a low chance of thunder towards the northwest.

Maximum wind: Light east or south-easterly winds, gusts 15-20mph on the highest summits.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 70% in the west, the best chances in the morning and early afternoon. 30% in the east.

Low cloud and visibility: Widespread, extensive cloud down to 200-300m with poor visibility in hill fog or outbreaks of rain or drizzle. Clear summits in the west with broken cloud to 1000m or higher.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 8 rising to plus 14 Celsius.
 At 800m: Plus 7 rising to plus 11 Celsius.
 Freezing level: Above summits.
