Forecast for Tuesday 08 Mar 2022

Weather: Dry for much of the day. Some low cloud at first, but the northwest seeing only small amounts. Then some lengthy sunny spells before it clouds over from the southwest later in the afternoon. Outbreaks of rain, with snow above 700 metres, will spread northeast for a time in the evening.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 70%

Low cloud and visibility: Poor in low cloud down to 500 metres at first, otherwise very good visibility for most of the day. Low cloud will become extensive from early evening down to 600 metres before becoming more broken from mid-evening.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Widespread upland gales developing by afternoon. Very gusty winds south to southeasterly expected, including on lee slopes. Gusts to 90 mph possible on the Cairngorm Plateau.

Forecast for Wednesday 09 Mar 2022

Weather: Low confidence for detail. After a dry morning outbreaks of rain and snow will spread from the west in the afternoon, before clearing away in the evening. Very windy in the morning.

Maximum wind: Southerly gusts 60 to 80 mph at first, winds slowly moderating to 40 mph by afternoon

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 20%

Low cloud and visibility: Widespread cloud down to 500 metres, although some breaks likely to the north of Cairngorm through the day

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 4 Celsius

At 800m: 0 to 2 Celsius

Freezing level: 800 metres, rising to higher summit level for a time later in the morning. Falling to 600 metres after dark
