Forecast for Monday 06 Jun 2022

Weather: Continuing fair with all staying dry, but sunshine and brighter spells will be more limited than through the weekend with some early lower cloud in the north, also quite a lot of higher cloud about through the rest of the day. West again warmest but temperatures generally down a little from Sunday.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 80% becoming 90% plus from late morning

Low cloud and visibility: Generally very good or excellent, becoming very poor within cloud, which lowers 500m at times, mainly early and in north.

Forecast for Tuesday 07 Jun 2022

Weather: South largely dry with occasional bright and sunny spells. Cloudier in north where the few light showers should be confined.

Maximum wind: East increasing 10-15mph from late afternoon

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 95% plus in south, 70% in north

Low cloud and visibility: Generally very good or excellent, becoming moderate in light showers and very poor within cloud, which infrequently lowers 500m, chiefly in the north

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 5 Celsius increasing 18 Celsius during the afternoon
At 800m: Plus 6 Celsius increasing 11 Celsius during the afternoon
Freezing level: Above summits
