Forecast for Thursday 10 Feb 2022

Weather: Scattered snow showers in the hours of darkness, these becoming mainly confined to western ranges later in the night. Clouding over through Thursday morning with outbreaks of snow spreading from the west, this then clearing away mid-afternoon onwards with western ranges first to clear. The evening will be dry with clear periods and a frost.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 30%, best chance later in the day

Low cloud and visibility: Poor in low cloud down to 700 metres for most of the day, some breaks possible to the northeast of Aviemore at first. Cloud breaking from the west as snow dies out, but may not clear the Cairngorms until late afternoon.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Hazardous winter conditions are expected on Thursday, with summit storms and snow leading a risk of blizzard like conditions at times until mid-afternoon. Some uncertainty in the strengths of the peak winds, these ease for a time in the morning but will increase again in the afternoon for a while. Freezing level may rise to 800 metres in the morning for a brief time too, but lowering in the afternoon.

Forecast for Friday 11 Feb 2022

Weather: A ridge of high pressure will give a mainly dry day, a few snow showers possible across the west. Cloud will thicken from the west through the day leading to rather flat light conditions. Snow will spread from the west towards midnight.

Maximum wind: Southwesterly 30 mph on the tops with severe wind chill. Increasing to 50 to 60 mph after dark on the tops

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 70%

Low cloud and visibility: Some patchy cloud down to 700 metres, this occasionally more extensive around Ben Alder and down towards Rannoch Moor

Temperature: **Glens:** Minus 10 rising to plus 3 Celsius
At 800m: Minus 2 Celsius
Freezing level: 200 metres rising to 600 metres by late afternoon
