



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A slowly southward-moving weather system will give 15-30 mm of rain quite widely across the area, with possibly as much as 60-80 mm in places through the whole day. Locally, 20-30 mm could fall within an hour.

This is an update to reduce the northern extent of the warning area.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **10:05 on Wed, 09th Aug 2017** until **23:55 on Wed, 09th Aug 2017**

An area of heavy rain will sink slowly southeastwards across the southeastern half of England during Wednesday. Some thundery bursts are likely, possibly locally torrential.

Some transport routes may be affected by localised flooding leading to longer journey times. In addition, flooding of homes and businesses is possible.
