Inshore Waters Forecast to 12 miles offshore
for the period 1800 UTC Monday 03 November to 1800 UTC Tuesday 04 November 2014

General Situation

An area of low pressure currently centred over Northern Ireland will gradually move southeastwards across great Britain during Tuesday and Wednesday. A cooler northerly airflow will eventually follow across all parts.

Cape Wrath to Rattray Head including Orkney - (SWW)

24 hour forecast:

Cyclonic 4 or 5 becoming northerly or northeasterly 5 to 7, occasionally gale 8 later in north.

Slight at first in south, otherwise moderate or rough, becoming rough or very rough in north.

Rain or thundery showers.

Good, occasionally moderate.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

Northeast 6 to gale 8 decreasing 4 or 5.

Rough or very rough becoming moderate or rough.

Showers.

Good, occasionally moderate at first.

Rattray Head to Berwick upon Tweed - (SWW)

24 hour forecast:

South or southwest 4 or 5 becoming variable 2 or 3, then north or northeast 5 to 7 later.

Slight or moderate, becoming moderate or rough later.

Rain or thundery showers.

Good, occasionally moderate.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

North or northeast 5 to 7, decreasing 4 later.

Moderate or rough, becoming moderate.

Showers.

Good.

Berwick upon Tweed to Whitby - (SWW)

24 hour forecast:

Southerly 4 or 5 becoming variable 2 or 3, then northeasterly 5 or 6 later in far north.

Slight or moderate, becoming slight.

Showers, thundery later.

Good, occasionally moderate later.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

Variable 2 or 3 at first in south, otherwise northerly or northeasterly 5 to 7, decreasing 4 later.

Slight, becoming moderate or rough.

Showers, thundery at first.

Good, occasionally moderate at first.

Whitby to Gibraltar Point

24 hour forecast:

South or southwest 4 or 5 becoming variable 3 or less.

Slight or moderate, becoming slight.

Showers, thundery later.

Good, occasionally moderate later.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

Variable 2 or 3 becoming north 4 or 5, occasionally 6 later.
Slight, becoming moderate or rough.
Showers, thundery at first.
Good, occasionally moderate at first.

Gibraltar Point to North Foreland

24 hour forecast:

Southwesterly 3 or 4, occasionally 5 at first, becoming variable 2 or 3 later.
Slight or moderate, becoming slight.
Rain or thundery showers.
Good, occasionally moderate.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

Variable 2 or 3 becoming northerly 4 or 5, occasionally 6 later.
Slight, becoming slight or moderate.
Thundery showers.
Good, occasionally moderate.

North Foreland to Selsey Bill - (SWW)

24 hour forecast:

Westerly or southwesterly 4 or 5, occasionally 6 at first, becoming variable 2 or 3 later.
Slight or moderate.
Rain or thundery showers.
Good, occasionally moderate.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

Variable 2 or 3 becoming northerly 4 or 5, occasionally 6 later.
Slight, occasionally moderate.
Thundery showers.
Good, occasionally moderate.

Selsey Bill to Lyme Regis - (SWW)

24 hour forecast:

Southwest 4 or 5, occasionally 6 at first, veering west or northwest 3 or 4 later.
Moderate, becoming slight or moderate.
Thundery showers.
Good, occasionally moderate.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

Northwest 3 or 4 veering north 4 or 5, occasionally 6 later.
Slight, occasionally moderate.
Thundery showers.
Good, occasionally moderate.

Lyme Regis to Lands End including the Isles of Scilly - (SWW)

24 hour forecast:

Westerly or southwesterly veering northwesterly, 5 or 6, decreasing 4 for a time, then occasionally 7 later in west.
Very rough at first near the Isles of Scilly, otherwise moderate or rough.
Thundery showers.
Good, occasionally moderate.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

Northwesterly 5 or 6, occasionally 7 at first in west, veering northerly 4 or 5.
Moderate or rough becoming slight or moderate.
Showers, thundery at first.
Good, occasionally moderate at first.

Lands End to St Davids Head including the Bristol Channel - (SWW)

24 hour forecast:

Westerly or southwesterly veering northwesterly, 4 or 5, increasing 5 to 7 later in west.

Moderate or rough.
Thundery showers.
Good, occasionally moderate.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:
Northwesterly backing northerly 4 or 5, but 5 to 7 at first in west.
Moderate or rough becoming slight or moderate.
Showers, thundery at first.
Good, occasionally moderate at first.

St Davids Head to Great Orme Head, including St Georges Channel - (SWW)
24 hour forecast:
West veering north 5 to 7, occasionally 4 at first.
Moderate or rough.
Thundery showers.
Good, occasionally moderate.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:
North 5 to 7 veering northeast 4 or 5.
Slight or moderate, occasionally rough at first in far north.
Thundery showers then fair.
Good, occasionally moderate at first.

Great Orme Head to the Mull of Galloway - (SWW)
24 hour forecast:
Southwesterly becoming cyclonic then northerly, 5 or 6, occasionally 7 at first in south, decreasing 4 at times in north.
Moderate or rough becoming slight or moderate.
Rain or thundery showers.
Good, occasionally moderate.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:
North or northeast 5 or 6, decreasing 4 later.
Slight or moderate, becoming slight later.
Showers then fair.
Good.

Isle of Man - (SWW)
24 hour forecast:
West 4 or 5 becoming cyclonic 3 or 4, then north or northeast 4 or 5, occasionally 6 later.
Slight or moderate.
Showers.
Good, occasionally moderate.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:
North or northeast 5 or 6, decreasing 3 or 4 later.
Slight or moderate, becoming slight later.
Showers then fair.
Good.

Lough Foyle to Carlingford Lough - (SWW)
24 hour forecast:
Cyclonic 4 or 5, occasionally 3 at first, becoming north 5 or 6.
Slight or moderate, occasionally rough in north.
Rain or thundery showers.
Good, occasionally moderate.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:
North 5 or 6 veering northeast 4 or 5, decreasing 2 or 3 later.
Moderate or rough at first in north, otherwise slight or moderate.
Showers then fair.
Good.

Mull of Galloway to Mull of Kintyre including the Firth of Clyde and North Channel - (SWW)

24 hour forecast:

Cyclonic becoming north or northeast, 4 or 5, occasionally 3 at first, increasing 6 at times later.

Slight or moderate.

Rain or thundery showers.

Good, occasionally moderate.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

North veering northeast 5 or 6, decreasing 3 or 4 later.

Slight or moderate, becoming slight later.

Showers then fair.

Good.

Mull of Kintyre to Ardnamurchan Point - (SWW)

24 hour forecast:

Northeast 4 or 5 backing north 5 to 7, occasionally gale 8 later near Coll and Tiree.

Moderate or rough.

Thundery showers.

Good, occasionally moderate.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

North 5 to 7 veering northeast 4 or 5, decreasing 2 or 3 later.

Moderate or rough, becoming slight.

Showers then fair.

Good.

The Minch - (SWW)

24 hour forecast:

North or northeast 4 or 5 increasing 6 to gale 8.

Slight or moderate becoming moderate or rough, then very rough later in north.

Thundery showers.

Good, occasionally moderate.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

North or northeast 6 or 7 decreasing 4 or 5, then veering east 2 or 3 later.

Very rough at first in north, otherwise moderate or rough becoming slight or moderate.

Showers then fair.

Moderate or good, becoming good.

Ardnamurchan Point to Cape Wrath - (SWW)

24 hour forecast:

North or northeast 4 or 5 increasing 6 to gale 8.

Moderate or rough becoming rough or very rough.

Thundery showers.

Good, occasionally moderate.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

North or northeast 6 or 7 decreasing 4 or 5, then veering east 2 or 3 later.

Rough or very rough becoming slight or moderate.

Showers then fair.

Moderate or good, becoming good.

For Coastal areas up to 60 nautical miles from Lerwick, Shetland

Valid Monday 03 Nov 2014 at 1800 UTC until Tuesday 04 Nov 2014 at 0600 UTC

Shetland Isles

General Situation

Complex low, initially extending from northern Scotland to Northern Ireland,

moving south and east into the North Sea and Northern England by midday Tuesday, bringing gale force NE winds to your location.

Gale Warnings in operation for Sea Area Fair Isle: Northeasterly gale force 8 expected later issued on Monday 3 November 2014 at 0344 UTC

Northeast 4 or 5, increasing 6 to gale 8.
Moderate or rough, becoming very rough later in northwest.
Showers then rain later.
Moderate or good, occasionally poor later.

Outlook for 12 Hours from 0600 UTC on Tuesday 04 Nov until 1800 UTC on Tuesday 04 Nov:

Northeast 6 to gale 8.
Rough or very rough, occasionally moderate at first.
Rain then showers.
Moderate or good, occasionally poor at first.

Channel Islands - (SWW)

24 hour forecast:

Southwest to west 4 to 5, locally 6 and gusty near showers, veering northwest decreasing 3 to 4 in the morning, increasing 4 to 5 by early evening.
Moderate to rather rough becoming slight to moderate tomorrow.
Scattered showers risk of thunder.
Good except in showers.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

Northwest 4 to 5 veering north increasing 5 to 6 overnight, decreasing 4 later in the afternoon.
Slight to moderate with swell, becoming moderate to rather rough for a time.
Isolated showers risk of thunder.
Good except in showers.
