Forecast for Sunday 04 Sep 2022

Weather: Outbreaks of rain, heavy at times, will continue on and off throughout the morning. Perhaps easing slightly late morning. A few brief sunny spells developing allowing showers to form, again heavy at times and also with the risk of thunder and hail. Perhaps a brief lull into the evening before further heavy rain arrives

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 600m: 40%.

Low cloud and visibility: Poor or very poor visibility expected during morning rain and low cloud, with bases between 400-500m. This improving into the early afternoon with low cloud becoming more patchy but still covering hills above 600-800m at times as showers pass through, which will also drop visibility to poor at lower levels. Cloud bases lowering again into the evening.

Meteorologist's View

Winds are likely to be strong both early and late with gales possible over higher ground, but a lull in the middle of the day. Some sunny spells in the afternoon may give moderate UV levels. Low confidence in precipitation details.

Forecast for Monday 05 Sep 2022

Weather: A cloudy start with outbreaks of rain during the early hours of Monday morning, these heavy and perhaps thundery at times. Turning drier by dawn with some sunny spells developing allowing isolated heavy perhaps thundery showers to form. Rain and heavy showers returning again during the afternoon.

Maximum wind: Southeasterly 25-30 mph, gusting 40-45 mph early and late.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops 600m: 30% to begin, rising to 70% for late morning onwards.

Low cloud and visibility: Extensive cloud down to 400m at first, lifting above summits and breaking during the morning. Perhaps areas of low cloud during the afternoon, bases 500-600m. Poor visibility at first, very poor in cloud, but good away from showers and low cloud.

Temperature: **Valleys:** Plus 12 Celsius, rising plus 21 Celsius.
At 600m: Plus 12 Celsius, rising to plus 15 Celsius.
Freezing level: Well above the summits.
