Here is the weather forecast for the inshore waters of Great Britain and Northern Ireland valid for the following 18 hours.

General Situation: Depression to west of Ireland will push active frontal bands across the United Kingdom.

From Cape Wrath to Duncansby Head including Orkney.
Wind: east or southeast 4 or 5, occasionally 6 in north.
occasional rain, isolated fog patches.
Visibility: moderate or good, occasionally very poor.

Shetland.
Wind: easterly 3 or 4, increasing 5 to 7.
occasional rain.
Visibility: moderate or good.

From Duncansby Head to Whitby.
Wind: south or southeast 4 or 5.
occasional rain, isolated fog patches.
Visibility: moderate or good, occasionally very poor.

From Whitby to North Foreland.
Wind: south or southeast 4 or 5, veering southwest 6 occasionally 7 near North Foreland.
occasional rain with fog patches, showers later.
Visibility: moderate or good, occasionally very poor.

From North Foreland to St. Catherine's Point.
Wind: southwest 5 to 7.
rain then showers.
Visibility: moderate or good.

From St. Catherine's Point to Lands End.
Wind: southwesterly 5 to 7, occasionally gale 8.
rain then showers.
Visibility: moderate or good.

From Lands End to Colwyn Bay.
Wind: southwesterly 4 or 5, increasing 6 or 7 near Lands End.
rain then showers.
Visibility: moderate or good.

From Colwyn Bay to Mull of Kintyre including Lough Foyle to Carlingford Lough.
Wind: south or southeast veering southwest 4 or 5.
rain then showers.
Visibility: moderate or good.

From Mull of Kintyre to Cape Wrath.
Wind: easterly for or 5, backing northeasterly 3 or 4.
rain or showers.
Visibility: moderate or good.
