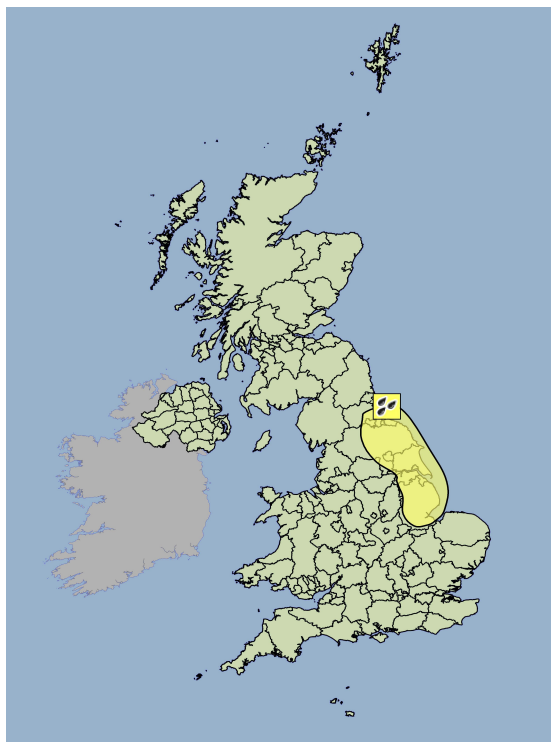




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Slack surface flow combined with instability and plenty of moisture is expected to lead to shower development through this morning. Although not all areas will see the showers any that do develop are expected to be slow moving, locally heavy and focused into lines by surface wind convergence. The resulting locally torrential downpours, that may persist for an hour or more in any one place, will bring the risk of localised surface water flooding. The showers will begin to ease later this afternoon and evening.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **08:00 on Sun, 06th Jul 2014** until **16:00 on Sun, 06th Jul 2014**

Slow moving showers are expected to develop this morning, lasting into the afternoon, before easing later. Some of the showers will bring heavy rainfall and the risk of localised surface water flooding.

The public should be aware of the potential for disruption to travel and outdoor events due to localised surface water flooding.
