



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

An area of low pressure will continue to track northwards through this weekend. Its fronts are expected to clear away northwestwards from mainland Scotland on Sunday morning, taking with them the area of persistent rain. However, conditions will become more unstable inland, especially by the afternoon when some heavy, thundery showers look likely, these slow-moving due to the light winds near the centre of the area of low pressure. Some areas may see 20 mm of rain fall in a short space of time whilst other nearby locations remain dry.

This warning will be reviewed and may be updated on Sunday.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **00:15 on Sun, 03rd Aug 2014** until **23:00 on Sun, 03rd Aug 2014**

Saturday's persistent, occasionally heavy rain will continue into the early hours of Sunday across parts of northern and western Scotland before clearing from most areas by mid morning. However, further scattered slow-moving thundery downpours may then develop. Some areas will miss these, but where they do occur some large rainfall totals may be experienced in short period of time.

The public should be aware of the risk of localised flooding and of disruption to transport and outdoor activities.
