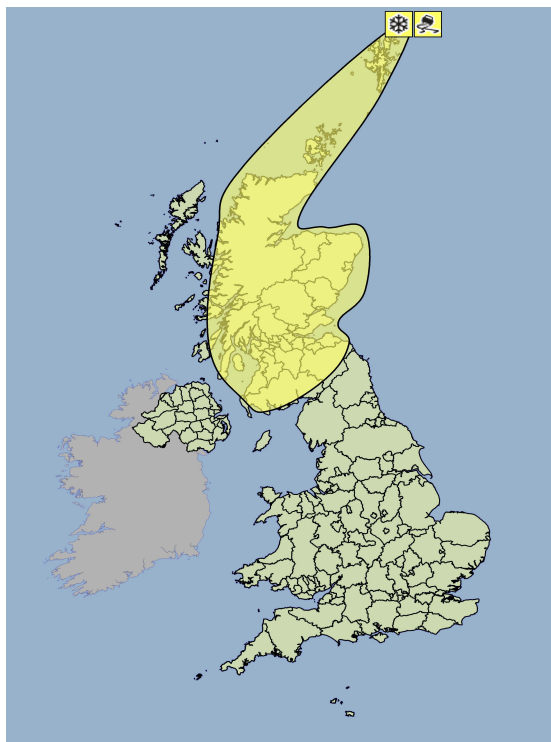




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

An occluded front will encounter cold air in its southeastward passage across Scotland. 5-10 cm of snow is possible in places above 200-300 m, especially across the northwest, but 2 cm possible to lower levels inland.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Snow and Ice**

Valid from **22:00 on Fri, 26th Dec 2014** until **12:00 on Sat, 27th Dec 2014**

Temperatures will fall quickly across Scotland this evening, before a band of locally heavy, wintry showers spreads into the northwest late evening. Showers will fall as snow on hills and higher routes and to lower levels inland. The band will move southeast overnight, showers becoming more scattered and not reaching the Central Belt and east of the country until late in the night. Showers will be mainly a mix of rain and snow over lower levels across the south on Saturday morning, before clearing, leaving only scattered wintry showers around coasts.

The public should be aware that icy conditions are expected in many places, especially over lying snow, but even low lying parts where rain has fallen, will see ice readily form on untreated surfaces as skies clear once showers move away.
