### Forecast for Sunday 10 Jan 2021

**Weather:** A few clear intervals overnight across the Angus and Aberdeenshire Hills otherwise mostly cloudy. Still mainly dry in the east of the area but occasional rain, drizzle with sleet and snow above 800m-900m, perhaps lower at first. Hill fog.

**Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m:** 20% - but ranging from little chance over western tops to a reasonable chance in the morning in the Aberdeenshire Hills but these chances diminishing as cloud spreads from the west..

**Visibility:** Mainly good in the east below the cloud level but occasionally moderate or poor in the west in rain and snow.

**Forecast for Monday 11 Jan 2021**

**Weather:** Cloudy with further mainly light rain, at all levels for a time, any heavier bursts in the west. Then colder air arriving from the north with rain turning to snow on the Aberdeenshire Hills by early afternoon then the south towards evening but not lasting too long before it becomes dry with clearing skies.

**Maximum wind:** Westerly 50 gusts 65mph becoming north or northeast 20 gusts 30mph in the colder air arriving in the afternoon and evening.

**Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m:** 10% or less, with extensive low cloud, a few brief clearances in the east, chances improving to 80% after dark.

**Visibility:** Occasionally good at lower levels in the east, but often moderate or poor in rain then snow. Then good in the clearer weather arriving in the evening

**Temperature:** **Glens:** Plus 8 Celsius falling to Minus 1 in the evening.  
**At 800m:** Plus 3 Celsius falling quickly to Minus 1 from the north as the snow arrives then Minus 3 in the evening.  
**Freezing level:** Just above summits for a time in morning then falling 500m from the north in the afternoon and to all levels in the evening.
