



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A front will move east across the UK this evening and overnight. This will bring a period of rain across Scotland and Northern Ireland. Over the higher routes in Scotland north of the Central Belt there is the risk of the rain turning to snow, this mainly above 300 metres where 2 to 5 cm of snow are possible. Following the rain, temperatures will dip sharply with widespread ice forming on any untreated surfaces.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Ice**

Valid from **19:00 on Sat, 01st Mar 2014** until **07:00 on Sun, 02nd Mar 2014**

A band of rain will cross Scotland and Northern Ireland during this evening and overnight with the chance of some temporary snow over some of the higher routes. After the clearance of the rain, temperatures will fall away sharply with widespread ice forming. The public are advised to be aware of this wintry hazard.
