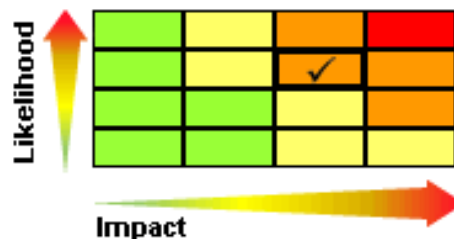
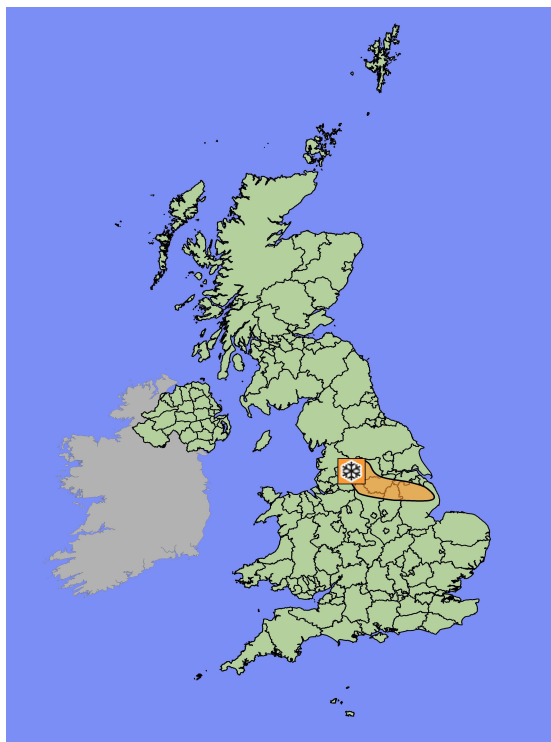




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Frequent heavy showers are expected to become aligned in a band across more southern parts of northern England during Monday night. There remains some uncertainty about the exact position of this band, but higher levels routes in the Pennines are likely to be worst affected.

The Met Office have issued an **Amber Warning of Snow**

Valid from **02:00 on Tue, 05th Feb 2013** until **09:00 on Tue, 05th Feb 2013**

Snow showers are expected to become aligned in a band across more southern parts of northern England and into the northeast Midlands and Lincolnshire during the early hours of Tuesday.

Amounts of snow will be variable, but where showers become aligned there is the potential for 10-15 cm of snow to accumulate within 6 hours, particularly above 100 metres, with drifting in the strong westerly winds.

The public should be prepared for disruption, particularly to transport, with trans-Pennine routes at particular risk.

This corrected Amber warning should be viewed alongside the wider Yellow Warning area.
