





National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Showers or more persistent areas of rain will continue through Wednesday night across northern, eastern and central England as well as parts of Scotland. This could fall as snow on hills, however the main threat is for ice, especially with clear spells between the showers allowing untreated surfaces to freeze. The showers could also lead to some wash-off of salt from roads that have already been treated.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Ice**

Valid from **04:15 on Thu, 03rd Mar 2016** until **09:00 on Thu, 03rd Mar 2016**

Wintry showers will continue through Wednesday night and Thursday morning, with some snow expected on higher ground. Clear spells between showers will allow ice to form on untreated surfaces.

Please be aware of some difficult driving conditions and the possibility of some disruption. This updated extends the warning area across the Midlands, where skies are clearing and road temperatures falling after earlier showers.
