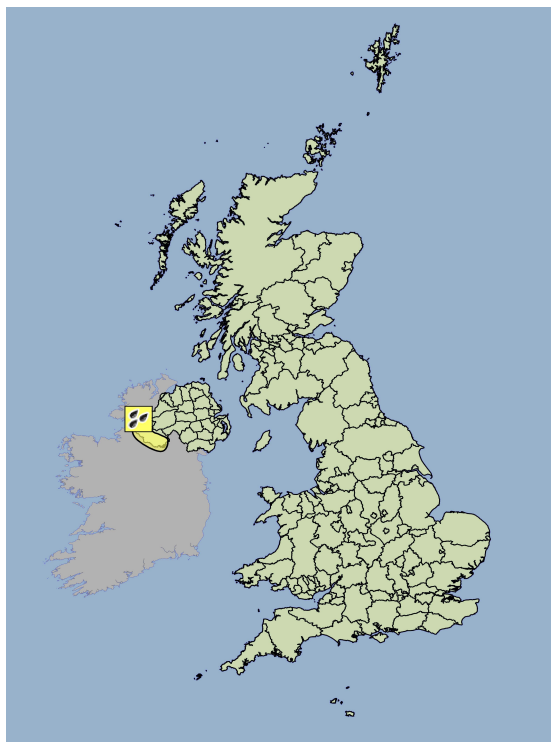




## National Severe Weather Warning Service



### Chief Forecasters Assessment

A frontal system will become slow-moving across Northern Ireland on Thursday afternoon and evening before clearing southeast by the early hours of Friday morning. Whilst the rainfall will be fairly widespread across the Province, the main concern area is in Fermanagh due to the high levels of Lough Erne.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **12:00 on Thu, 06th Mar 2014** until **23:59 on Thu, 06th Mar 2014**

Outbreaks of rain will become persistent and heavy at times on Thursday afternoon and evening, before clearing around midnight. 15-20mm of rain is likely, and with river and lough levels still high in the area, this may lead to some localised flooding.
