Forecast for Wednesday 03 Feb 2021

Weather: A murky and damp start to the day although the cloud will lift and break, allowing a bit of hazy sunshine during the day, particularly in the south. Becoming cloudier during the evening, with a few outbreaks of drizzle or light rain, perhaps sleet at times.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 600m: 70-80% with just a scattering of lower cloud in the north which may shroud the tops in showers.

Visibility: Generally poor during the early hours but becoming moderate or good when cloud begins to lift in the morning.

Meteorologist's View

Freezing level falling as cold air from the north begins to sink south but remaining above the summits.

Forecast for Thursday 04 Feb 2021

Weather: A period of rain and sleet is likely in the early morning but becoming drier and brighter later in the day. Remaining mainly cloudy throughout.

Maximum wind: Southeasterly 15mph with gusts 25-30mph.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 600m: 30%. Cloud is likely to be broken at low level during the morning, perhaps 70% in the afternoon as cloud lifts and breaks especially in the west.

Visibility: Poor or very poor in low cloud, bases around 500m. Visibility becoming good later in the day as cloud lifts above the summits, visibility is likely to be better in the west.

Temperature: **Valleys:** Plus 2 rising to plus 5 Celsius.
At 600m: Plus 0-1 Celsius
Freezing level: around 1000m
